The First Responsibility – Care

CHERISH THE MIRACLE OF LIFE ON OUR PLANET, *BOTH IN OURSELVES AND OTHERS*

1. Learn and practice empathy to appreciate diversity and recognize every individual as worthy of dignity.
2. Learn and practice self-appreciation and personal development.
3. Learn about human history, our own society, other peoples, cultures, and communities.
4. Set and achieve global goals that balance continuation and progress for the flourishing of all life.
5. Protect shared resources, world heritage and preserve life on Earth.

The Second Responsibility - Community

PROTECT ALL PEOPLE EQUALLY, *WITHOUT DISCRIMINATION OF ANY KIND*

6. Proactively advocate for equality regarding civic rights, duties, and opportunities.
7. Provide universal and easy access to security, education, healthcare, justice, and living wages.
8. Invest in universal access to basic infrastructure and guarantee the social ladder for all.
9. Promote social inclusion and create appropriate structures to support those who are dependent or vulnerable.
10. Remember the past and consider the effects on future generations when making decisions today.

The Third Responsibility - Choice

LIVE UNDER THE PRINCIPLE OF EQUAL FREEDOM, *IN FULL RESPECT OF ONE ANOTHER*

11. Live by our personal values under the rule of law and ethics.
12. Honor commitments and policies that yield results to build mutual trust and good governance.
13. Learn and educate others about the repercussions of everyday choices and their global impact.
14. Be informed and engage responsibly as citizens of our nation and of the world.
15. Actively strive for the preservation of freedom and promote dialogue for peaceful conflict resolution.

The Fourth Responsibility - Capability

ACHIEVE PROSPERITY THROUGH SHARED COMPETENCE, *IN BALANCE WITH OUR ECOSYSTEMS*

16. Align individual, private, and public interests to support mutual service for the achievement of global goals.
17. Measure success with credible goals, transparent data, and be accountable about progress or the lack thereof.
18. Develop and invest in the most relevant systems and abilities to achieve global goals effectively.
19. Keep our ecosystems sustainable, in balance with human activity, and use scarce resources thoughtfully.
20. Prevent and reduce systemic risks using data, reason, and continuous learning.
